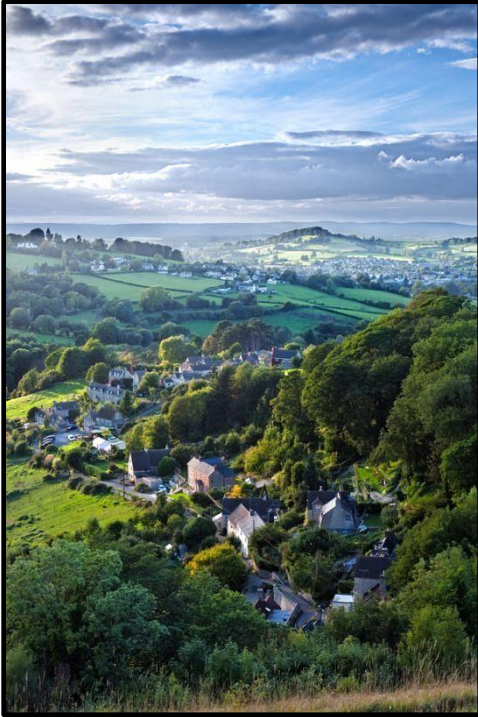

Minor in Leadership

Given the complex world in which we live and the need for leaders to manage change, ethical leadership development assumes an even greater importance. The mission of OSU's Leadership Minor Program, open to all students, is to help develop students' knowledge about ethical leadership and practices for the common good. The program seeks to develop knowledge of leadership theory and ethical practice through intellectual study and meaningful personal experience. This minor will prepare students to enter into their desired field of study as experienced, well-prepared, thoughtful and ethical leaders. One of the foremost and historical purposes of higher education is the preparation of students as citizen-leaders in society. This purpose remains an essential component of the educational mission of Oklahoma State University.

To achieve the Leadership Minor, students are required to take six hours of course work in three separate areas (18 hours)

Content Course Work: 6 hours

*HESA 2513: Foundations of Ethical Theory and Leadership
HESA 4513: Leadership for the Common Good*

Practica: 6 hours

*UNIV 3110: Field Experience I (3 hours)
UNIV 3110: Field Experience II (3 hours)*

Electives: 6 hours

Coursework within or outside of the major as approved by the minor's central staff.

Service Learning

Each student must also successfully complete at least 40 hours of documented service learning experiences or community service related to the students' stated goals for admission. Upon completion of the academic and experiential requirements, each student will be required to meet with their Leadership Minor mentor to prepare, present and discuss a reflective analysis of their total experience in achieving the minor. In addition, students will be expected to participate in the design and/or delivery of a public forum.
